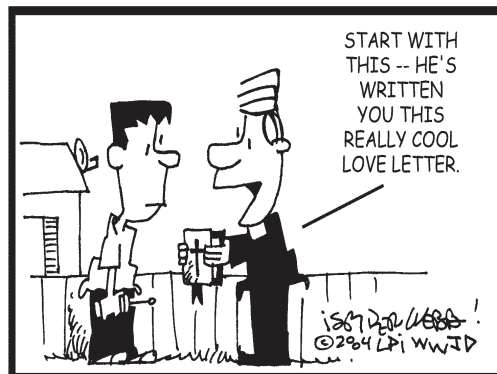
Confirmation registrations are past due
